## 1. News

- a. For up to date news from across the Space ecosystem we strongly recommend you sign up to the <u>Space Enterprise Community (SEC)</u> which is run by the Space Applications Catapult and brings access to all the latest news and events as well as providing opportunities to connect and collaborate.
- b. Work on a cutting-edge X-ray telescope has been completed at Space Park Leicester and the final instrument has been handed over to Airbus to join the SMILE mission. The telescope will be integrated into a spacecraft that will make new insights into the solar winds that bombard our planet's magnetosphere. Read this and other news from Space Park here.
- c. Congratulations to Midlands-based company <u>D-RisQ Ltd</u> who were selected to take part in the inaugural **Airbus Defence and Space UK Accelerator**. The programme, which was announced at the Farnborough International Airshow this summer, is the first of its kind and part of the wider Community for Space Prosperity (CUSP) initiative to develop the UK's #space ecosystem. D-RisQ's new toolset is believed to be a first-of-its-kind set of tools, underpinned by formal methods, for the development and verification of control systems software.

Nick Tudor – CEO of D-Risq, told us "Working with the cohort selected by Airbus Defence and Space UK on the programme delivered by Plexal has given us an excellent insight into the space sector, building upon our work in aerospace, medical devices, nuclear, automotive and autonomous vehicles and we look forward to exploiting our technologies in the space sector ...and beyond."

- d. Midlands Space Cluster has this month commissioned build of **a new website** to enhance our presence in the eco-system. The website is due to go live in the coming months and we will be including a listing of all Midlands Space Cluster participants, academic and industrial.
